This year, 2018, *Hipertext.net* celebrates its fifteenth anniversary and it does so by introducing a number of changes. The first is to double its frequency of publication, so that from now on we shall bring out two issues each year in the months of May and November. This change has been made possible thanks to the forging of close ties with various international congresses – *Ciberperiodismo* (Bilbao), *Comunica2* (Gandía, Valencia) and *SCC-IEC* (Barcelona) – allowing us to identify and publish the best papers presented at each event. A double peer-review process, involving both the respective congress committees and *Hipertext.net*, will be carried out to select articles for publication. The first issue of 2018, which you have in your hands now, is the result of these fruitful collaborations.

The second issue of each year, to be published in November, will have a guest editor. This issue will be centred around a specific theme and will include an international call for papers.

The November 2018 issue will be entitled ***The Digital Future of Facts*** and is to be edited by Dr Carles Sora. We have launched a call for articles that remains open until June 10 and encourage you to submit your work. Further details are available at:

Hipertext.net also celebrates its fifteenth anniversary by revamping its design. The new PDF format incorporates a number of improvements in relation to its indexing, journal archiving and open access model. All articles are published in open access on the *Hipertext.net* portal under the Creative Commons 4.0 licence. Authors are encouraged to disseminate their work in academic archives, social networks and portals so as to contribute to the diffusion of knowledge in the academic community and society.

Over the last fifteen years, *Hipertext.net* has published around 130 articles, which according to Google Scholar have, as of December 2017, garnered more than 1200 citations. This uninterrupted production is thanks not only to the authors of the papers, but also to the efforts of the journal's two directors, Dr Lluís Codina and Dr Cristòfol Rovira, without whom *Hipertext.net* would not exist today. We should like to take this opportunity to thank both of them publicly for their generosity, vision and unfailing dedication. Thanks to Cristòfol Rovira and Lluís Codina, since 2003, the *DigiDoc* research group and the Department of Communication at the Pompeu Fabra University have enjoyed access to a magnificent forum for sharing, learning and disseminating knowledge about digital documentation and interactive communication.
